Objectives

The aim of the webinar is to review what processes supported by DeSIRA projects need to be continued – in particular those innovations targeting behavioral changes that require time and cannot be directly scaled out or up but rather need to be disseminated –, and what other processes can move beyond pilots or proofs of concepts through a blend of specific funding (including investments), access to markets, and a conducive environment.

The webinar will help identify scalable processes and those to be continued as well as who and how should be reached out to ensure this continuation.

Background and questions

The EU-funded DeSIRA initiative (Development Smart Innovation through Research in Agriculture, in short DeSIRA) was launched in 2018 with the aim of strengthening Research and Innovation, within an AIS perspective, in order to support sustainable transformation of agri-food systems.

With many projects arriving at their final stage and the DeSIRA+ Initiative about to be launched, it is necessary for project implementers to reinforce their exit strategies, and to consider what will be left for innovators and countries where projects have been implemented, to continue and sustain innovation processes or scale them.

DeSIRA LIFT is proposing a series of three webinars under the title Scaling DeSIRA to organize the reflection around the continuation of innovations beyond the time boundaries of projects, We want to identify what processes need to be continued – in particular those innovations targeting behavioral changes that require time and cannot be directly scaled out or up but rather need to be disseminated –, and what other processes can move beyond pilots or proofs of concepts through a blend of specific funding (including investments), access to markets, and a conducive environment.

Yet, for Research and Innovation projects, stepping beyond donor funding and meeting users that can scale innovations, requires connecting with other dynamics for which they are not necessarily immediately equipped.

This series of webinars therefore intends to provide space for exchanges of experiences and to raise awareness – thanks to some frameworks - about potential pathways that projects could take. It also intends to gradually bring on board DeSIRA and other Research and Innovation related actors, particularly those organizations operating at regional level in the agricultural field, but also other players in the environment such as Regional Economic Groupings.

The first webinar will be about Innovation processes and scalability, with three underlying questions:

- What processes, started or reinforced during DeSIRA projects, need to be continued, with which support, to what end, and who should they involve?
- What processes or innovations started, reinforced or demonstrated thanks to DeSIRA projects should be transferred to other stakeholders to be scaled out or up?
- · How should this support and those stakeholders be mobilized?

The next two webinars, planned at the end of January and the end of February 2024 will address linkages and articulation between national, regional and continental innovation agendas and whether DeSIRA projects can provide avenues for coordination, and finally look at how to access funding, either private to scale marketable innovations or public to continue additional research, among this what the role of DeSIRA+ could be.
