Detail and articulation of workshops and round tables

Workshop concept: exchange of experiences, lessons and reflections from the implementation of DeSIRA projects.

Objectives: observe and measure the modalities and achievements of research participation in DeSIRA projects in terms of project formation and strategies, interaction with partners and beneficiaries, advances for research and development; provide useful lessons for projects, their organizations, donors; detect implicit synergies that may contribute to or form the basis of regional strategies.

Modalities

Presentations 45mn	After an introduction to the topic, a series of presentations are organized in the form of 9-minute "flashes" on a specific aspect of the project, with supporting slides. The goal is to offer participants a rich but simplified picture of the diversity of research contributions, so that they can debate the issues on the Panel. During the presentations Post-it notes are distributed on which everyone, from their seats, can write a question while they listen. Facilitators collect the post-it notes at the end of each session and stick them on posters to the side.	
Question recap 5mn At the end of the presentations, there is a 5 minute break in the facilitators consult and add notes by topic to incorporate into the Panel.		
Discussion panel 45mn	Based on the questions and reactions of the room recorded in the post-it notes, a discussion is organized between presenters and the room, each of the presenters is also offered to react on their respective presentations, given that each project shares some characteristics with others.	

Concept of round tables: discussions between stakeholders on topics that cut across the DeSIRA initiative that could benefit from and scale the results and impacts of DeSIRA.

Objectives: put into perspective the innovation trajectories of DeSIRA projects in regional contexts, invite interested parties to the themes and results, present their interests and agendas and how the achievements of the projects can feed or reorient their strategies, determine the conditions to continue existing trajectories, in particular through alliances between parties at the level of support for innovators, research and training and policy.





Modalities

Presentations 50mn	After an introduction to the topic, fed by the conclusions of the workshops in order to frame the presentations and discussions in the field of the innovation trajectories of the projects, some interested parties present their position on the matter and their vision of how they could benefit and continue the progress made through the projects in terms of resources, strategies, interactions, alliances and policies in order to strengthen the Agricultural Innovation System in its capacity to provide favorable conditions for innovation, consolidate results and eliminate risks of setback. During the presentations Post-it notes are distributed on which everyone, from their seats, can write a question while they listen. Facilitators collect the post-it notes at the end of each session and stick them on posters to the side.	
Question recap 5mn	At the end of the presentations, there is a 5 minute break in which the facilitators consult and add notes by topic to incorporate them into the discussion.	
Discussion 35mn	Based on the questions and reactions of the room recorded in the post-it notes, a discussion is organized between presenters and the room, each of the presenters is also offered to react on their respective presentations, suggest and develop scenarios for future presentations. Project Fair

The principle of the Projects Fair is to provoke meetings, to de-silo and foster mutual recognition and identification of similarities across projects. This is achieved with a blend of rapid presentations (5 mn speed-dating-like pitches) and a display of posters, leaflets and possibly one short video, illustrating the objectives, achievements and lessons learnt by each project.

The purpose is to trigger reflections and discussions and identify outcome trajectories that will then be structured and refined through the workshops to sketch possible futures and regional strategies.

In the project fair

- Each project has a stand/table where its objectives, achievements, lessons learnt, and perspectives are displayed.
- Participants move from one table to the other, and each project gives a presentation.
- The option of a few stands/tables for other projects with similar objectives can be envisaged.

Topics

DeSIRA has a specific assumption that articulating research with agricultural innovation will generate potentially different, deeper and linger outcomes, with higher ownership from local and regional actors and stakeholders. These outcomes range from behavioural changes at the level of innovation, and often farming, communities as well as at the level of the innovation support provides and the broader Agricultural Innovation System (AIS). This rippling effect requires that organizations who have a mandate to work towards agricultural innovation and who link research to innovation on a regular basis, own the results of DeSIRA and are able to digest them and reinject them in their own strategies. This roundtable is meant so have the views of prominent research and extension organisations in the region in the process of agricultural innovation, what their role has been and how they can make use of the results of DeSIRA, to the implementation of which most of them have been associated.

Topics

DeSIRA projects are part of broader agendas (fight against climate change, preservation of biodiversity, SDGs, Food Systems Agenda) to which they seek to contribute by combining the actions of multiple actors: researchers, producers, rural communities, governments, etc.... These actions are often fed by previously initiated processes (research, public policies, organisation of producers and territories) to which DeSIRA innovations bring new stages. Roundtable 3 (2h30)
Research and knowledge informing policies and strategies

Day 3 08.00-10.30

Topics

This roundtable proposes to review existing strategies and policies in terms of the broad objectives of the DeSIRA initiative, and the extent to which they shape an enabling environment for the agricultural innovation system in the countries of the region. This rapid review seeks to identify policies that support agricultural innovation and how the role of R&D research is defined in these policies. It looks at the articulation between science and policy, in particular at the capacity of science to provide data and analysis to provide objective elements to decision-makers, while contributing to their better understanding and assessment of problems and workable solutions to solve them. It will look at how, through regional organisations in particular, coordination and scale effects can be sought and fostered.

Specifically, it will review the developments provided by the DeSIRA projects and analyse how these developments resonate with existing policies and can be a source of information to confirm or invalidate the relevance of such policies and how to adjust them for greater effectiveness. It will also emphasise that small-scale advances can only have an impact if they are replicated and systematized through public policy.
